RIVER EDGE, N.J. - Adults with special needs in the new P.R.I.D.E. of Bergen program will be able to communicate better thanks to a generous donation from the UNICO Foundation that was used in part to purchase an iPad.

The adult day program, which opened last month, is for graduates of ECLC's school in Ho-Ho-Kus who are not yet ready to enter the work force. Instead of languishing at home, these young people can continue to enhance their independent living and social skills through this program.

The UNICO Foundation has supported ECLC of New Jersey for many years and decided to earmark this donation for the new adult program. UNICO is the largest Italian-American service organization in the United States, giving millions to worthy causes across the country.
